

X Marks the Spot

Year 2

The children in Year 2 will go on a voyage next term and will become members of a pirate crew. Each week they will be visited by a pirate who will set them a different task or pose a problem for them to solve. It will be up to the children to think of different ways in which to do so. Much of this topic is experience based so please don't reveal too much of this information to your child ahead of time.

English

During this topic, the children's writing will be inspired by their experiences, ensuring all writing is purposeful. They will take part in research projects, plot oceanic voyages and write setting descriptions. Later in the topic, the children will write stories and inspired by their time with the pirate.

In our Reading Comprehension lessons, the children will practise reading lengthy texts and answer retrieval questions (where the answer is in the text). They will also start to answer inference questions where the answer is "between the lines".



Maths

This half term we will begin learning about multiplication and division. This will include the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. Please do not jump

ahead and teach your child/ren any of the other times tables as we need them to build a high level fluency in the tables outlined above.

Science

In Science, we will be focusing on the properties of materials. The children will learn about different materials and what they could be used for. They will also take part in experiments to investigate the suitability of materials for different purposes, such as absorbency and buoyancy in relation to pirate ships.

Geography

In this topic, the children will be learning about the world's oceans and continents. We will be focusing on a Caribbean Island and comparing it to life in Dunmow.

History

In History we will be looking specifically at pirate ships and learning to identify them compared to other ships. We will be thinking about how pirate ships are different to other types of boats.

Art

In Art, the children will use tools to make our own clay pirate coins. They will also use their artistic skills when creating their own pirate journals.

DT

In DT the children will learn about the importance of a healthy diet and how pirates

would often suffer from scurvy. They will make hardtack and a fruit salad.

Music/Dance

The children will compose their own Sailor Hornpipe dances and create their own pirate dance moves in PE lessons.

Computing

During Computing this half term the children will be using the Chromebooks to explore Google tools, including Google Earth and Google Slides.
